OVERVIEW

- A new destination home for CARGO overlooking the floating harbour and Museum Square.
- Space for independent businesses including shops and eateries within a two-storey podium
- 245 apartments above the podium of a range of sizes and tenures, including 20% affordable.
- 5000sqm new workspace
- Over 30% site area given over to pedestrian public realm and landscaping
- Significant boost to local ecology & biodiversity

KEY ACTIVITIES & CHANGES SINCE PUBLIC CONSULTATION

CARGO

- Working with CARGO tenants to understand their needs & identifying where every tenant will go in the new plans
- The CARGO building has been redesigned to reflect the character of the existing shipping containers with covered walkways and external staircases
- The CARGO Hall has been re-designed with shipping container cladding, a brighter colour scheme and individual pods businesses can tailor to their own needs

Building Height & Appearance:

- Reviewing height and massing with Historic England and reducing the tallest elements of the scheme
- The double-height restaurant on the top of the landmark building has been removed as well as restaurants from upper levels, lowering the building and giving it a more slender appearance
- An open-air publicly-accessible rooftop restaurant and viewing terrace has been introduced on the sixth floor, offering expansive views across the harbourside
- One storey has been removed from block 3, behind M Shed
- The greenery on the facades of the residential buildings has been re-designed in line with new government fire safety regulations

Housing:

• We have provided 20% affordable homes including four three-bedroom homes for social rent
